CLEVELAND (UPI)—The federal grand jury investigating the possibility of anti-trust violations by professional football clubs heard testimony Tuesday from former Cleveland Browns defensive end Paul Wiggin and Tim Temerario, the director of player personnel for the Washington Redskins.

Wiggin, a graduate of Stanford, is now defensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers.

Temerario, who has been in his present post for six years, also formerly played with the Browns in the early 1950s.
